

ORDINANCE NO. 2, SERIES 1991

CITY OF KINGSLEY, KENTUCKY

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF CITY STREETS BY TRUCKS OR DELIVERY VANS LONGER THAN THIRTY-FIVE FEET IN LENGTH AND SEMI TRAILERS LONGER THAN SIXTY-FIVE FEET, WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Kingsley, Kentucky, have the authority pursuant to statute to enact Ordinances relating to the City, and

WHEREAS, for the safety of the City's residents, guests and pedestrians, it has become necessary to regulate the use of city streets by trucks or delivery vans longer than thirty-five feet in length and semi-trailer trucks longer than sixty-five feet, within the city limits,

BE IT ORDAINED THAT:

Section 1. No person shall operate on any street or public way of the city any motor truck whose length, including any part of body or load, shall exceed 35 feet, for other than delivery to a city resident.

Section 2. No person shall operate on any street or public way of the city any semi-trailer truck whose length, including any part of body or load, shall exceed 65 feet, for other than delivery to a city resident.

Section 3. A violation of this Ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor, and any person/s convicted of an offense thereunder shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$15.00 nor more than \$100.00, for each such offense.

This Ordinance shall become effective upon its passage and publication.
