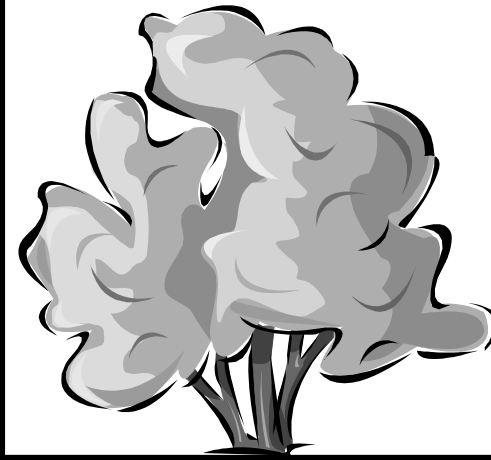

Premium Insurance Tax Notice

KARS91A.080 (Kentucky law) allows counties, cities and metro government to tax most insurance premiums. Within Kingsley the rate is 5%.

Please make sure your insurance carriers know you live in Kingsley. When you receive your insurance notice please check to make sure Kingsley is listed under the Municipal tax section. This will help ensure these funds are returned to Kingsley. These tax dollars help our City when we are budgeting the revenue.

Snow Removal

The City has contracted for snow removal during the winter season. The contractor will be plowing the snow, and applying salt or other melting chemicals on the roads.

We need the cooperation of all residents to move your vehicles from the streets to your driveways to allow the contractor to make a clean sweep of the roadway. This will improve the contractor's ability to clear the roads and make them safe for everyone.



Change In Meeting Dates

Normally the City Commissioners Meeting and the Tree Board meeting are held on the first Thursday of every month. In 2015 the January meeting would have fallen on New Years Day. Due to the holiday, the meetings are being rescheduled for Thursday, January 8th, 2015.

The Tree Board meeting will be at 6:00PM, followed by the City Commissioners Meeting at 7:00PM.

For the remainder of 2015 the meetings will revert back to the first Thursday of every month.

Parking Reminders

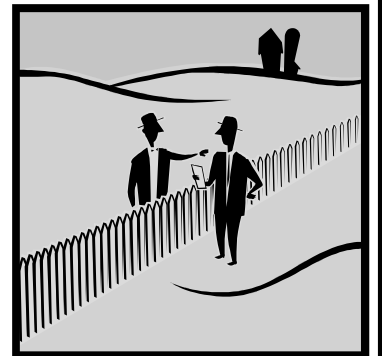
Check the City of Kingsley web site for parking regulations within the City.

Street Lights

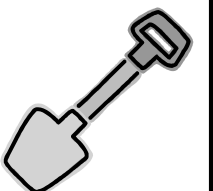

It sounds innocent enough to dig a hole to plant a tree or do other construction improvements but if you or a contractor accidentally cut an underground service wire, it could end up costing you thousands of dollars. Additionally Kentucky State Law requires residents and contractors to Call Before You Dig. Don't guess - call 811.
